Welcome to Mass today!

If you are new to the area or this church, please make yourself known to one of the priests after Mass. There is tea and coffee available after the Solemn Mass in the Rectory, we hope you'll come through.

In the gospel reading today, we hear that the Son of Man is coming in power and glory. Christ has died once, and for all. We await the second coming when he will gather his chosen ones from the four corners of the earth. On that day we will understand God's plan for our salvation and we will praise him for his compassion and mercy towards us.



Sunday School at the 11.30am Mass is for Children of Primary School age. They are invited to join the others at the *Gloria*, follow the Cross.

A second collection next week *Catholic Youth Service*.

Step into Advent - a study day exploring the readings and themes of Advent. Saturday 24th Nov 10.30am-3.30pm at Warwick Street, led by Fr Hemer.

Christ the King is next week and the last Sunday of the Christian Year, so Advent is not far away. On the last Sunday of the year we give thanks for all the Graces received here at MPB and will have our usual Procession of the Blessed Sacrament.

November is the month of Holy Souls when we pray for the Faithful Departed. *Lord for your faithful, life is changed, not ended.*

The Casket at the front of Church is for names of anyone you wish to remember during this month of Holy Souls. Write their names on a slip of paper at the back. Mass is offered for them each week. Offering can be made by cash given to FrC in the Holy Souls Envelope or electronically.

The New Lighting Scheme installation begins tomorrow. We are planning to scaffold the interior of the Church, so expect a little disruption. MPB will be open for Mass but access will be limited for safety reasons.

Enjoy the floor for the last time today for a while. It's being covered in preparation for the lighting and re-decoration. Now we have it, we want to protect it. The time schedule is not brief: probably till mid-to-late February.

Floor Intention Requests were sent out last week. Thank you to those who have responded. There is a list at the back for final checks. Please see that your intention is there and that the spelling is correct. Let FrC know. The + cross after someone's name indicates they have died.

The Ordinariate Pilgrimage to Rome in Nov 2019 is on hold. The hint of the Canonisation of Bl John Henry Newman and plans for an Academic Symposium has caused too much uncertainty about dates. Watch this space.
