## Welcome to Mass today!

If you are new to the area or this church, please make yourself known to one of the priests after Mass. There is tea and coffee available after the Solemn Mass in the Rectory, we hope you'll come through.

**In the gospel reading today**, we hear that we are to love one another. Jesus tells us that we are known as his disciples by the caring love we show for one another. We have to love one another as he has loved us. In this way we will open the doors of faith to the pagans and give them the opportunity to praise God who makes all things new.



**Sunday School** at the 11.00am Mass is for Children of Primary School age, who are invited into the Long Room for a Liturgy of the Word. Follow the Cross at the *Gloria*.

**Rosary** each Sunday morning at 10.40am during Mary's month of May.

**Elections** for many of us on Thursday this week. Sick of Brexit? Who isn't. Still vote.

**A Mass of Consecration** will take place on Monday 1st July at 6.30pm. The Archbishop has agreed to come on the Feast of the Most Precious Blood. Put in the diary.

**Confirmation and First Communion** preparation begins this Saturday at 4pm for the younger Group. There are lots of adults who *never got round to it*, so there's a short course for you. See FrC asap.

**Marion Marple's funeral** is at St Saviour's Cathedral on Tuesday 28th at 11am. Many will know Marion from the extraordinary commitment she had to local community and the Christian Faith. We knew her well at MPB as one of the champions of her Ecumenical Endeavours. Please pray for her and her family. *Lord have mercy....*

**Ascension Day** is Thursday week and a Day of Obligation. Mass at 1.05pm & 6.30pm

**Holy Communion** must be received reverently, loving and immediately. There has been some scandalous activity recently where wicked and shameful individuals have secreted the Most Blessed Sacrament from Mass rather than consume It. When receiving Holy Communion, consume It *straight away*. Please be vigilant for yourself, and others too!

**The Donation Board** is about to be manufactured, and once made, cannot be altered. It's printed overleaf, so please double, and triple check spelling and accuracy. He'll push the button on Friday!

**Posture at Mass** is an important way of showing what we believe is going on. Sitting to listen to the Word, standing for respect of Jesus in the Gospel and so on. At Mass the only person who addresses the Father is the priest, and the people give assent by 'Amen'. He hold his hands open to do this. Again, at Mass, only the priest does this, even during the Lord's Prayer!



## What is a Morning Offering?

The Morning Offering is a prayer in which we consecrate the day to God and ask for His help to live it as a day of the Lord.

It's normally best prayed once one is alert enough to pray. For some, that can be as soon as they arise. For others, it means once they've had a cup of coffee or after they've been awakened in the shower. For those who set aside a period of time to pray each morning before the day gets going, it can be delayed until that time of prayer begins.

The key is to pray it early, before one has gotten distracted by news, emails, social media or chores.

The Morning Offering helps us start the day focused on the purpose of time and the meaning of our life. St. Paul wrote to the first Christians, "I urge you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your Spiritual worship" (Rom 12:1-2). Those who make the Morning Offering begin the day by offering their body, mind, heart, soul and strength to God.

The Morning Offering can be long or short. It can be done with one's own words or with those written by someone else.

One of the shortest morning offerings is simply to say "Serviam!," which means "May I serve!" This commitment to serve God and others during the day is in direct opposition to the devil's attempts to get us to make his ego-centric, "Non serviam!," his refusal to obey God, our motto and lifestyle.

The 19th century French Apostleship of Prayer popularized a longer Morning Offering that has found its way into many prayer books:

"O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer You my prayers, works, joys, and

sufferings of this day in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world. I offer them for all the intentions of Your Sacred Heart: the Salvation of souls, reparation for sin, and the reunion of all Christians. I offer them for the intentions of our bishops and of all Apostles of prayer, and in particular for those recommended by our Holy Father this month."

You could kneel down at the side of the bed facing a crucifix and, to ensure you're praying sincerely rather than routinely, say it in your own words.

St. John Paul II once said that praying the Morning Offering is "of fundamental importance in the life of each and every one of the faithful. It is a daily reminder to make our entire day, our whole life 'a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God.'"

In his Morning Offering, he would consecrate the day to God through Mary, renewing the consecratory prayer of St. Louis de Montfort from which his papal motto, *Totus Tuus*, was taken. He would also pray in a special way for all those whom he would meet during the day, that he might receive each of them as a gift and become a vicarious sign for them of Christ's presence in return.

It doesn't have to be long, just regular and sincere. It will change your day, it might even change your life.

for the intentions of all my relatives  
and friends,  
and in particular  
for the intentions of the Holy Father.


